THINGS TO KNOW

- Admission is open **ONLY** to Central Falls residents who are grade appropriate at the time of application.
 - Lottery application **deadline is February 15, 2019.**
- Completing a lottery application **does not** guarantee a spot in our school.
- Enrollment is determined by a random lottery drawing on March 1, 2019.
- The lottery is open to the public, it is recommended families be present at the lottery drawing but no required to gain admissions to the Segue IFL.
- If your student does not get selected for a spot in the lottery. They will be placed on a waiting list before other applicants. Segue will fill any seats that become available either before or after the beginning of the school year by going to the "waiting list" and following the order in which names were drawn and given a slot number.
- If you submit an enrollment application after March 1st, the student will be placed at the bottom of the waiting list by first come, first served basis.
- Please note that our policy states that "sibling" means "one of two or more individuals having one common parent."
 - It is Parents duty to contact the school with any changes in contact information.
